VARSITY LETTER IN COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD

United Way of Olmsted County partners with local high schools in Olmsted, Dodge, Fillmore, and Winona counties to recognize and reward students for their volunteer efforts in the community. Students who volunteer 100 or more hours of service in a year can earn their school varsity letter, similar to those earned in academics, arts, and athletics.

Applicants must meet the following basic qualifications:

- Be a student in grades 9-12 attending a school in Olmsted, Dodge, Winona, or Fillmore Counties during the 2024-2025 school year. Homeschooled students affiliated with a local school district are also eligible to apply.
- Complete at least 100 hours of community service from March 1, 2024 to February 28, 2025.
 - 60 hours must be completed locally
 - 40 hours must be non-school related volunteering
- All volunteer activities must be photographed or verified by the volunteer supervisor on organization letterhead.

Your application must be received by United Way of Olmsted County by March 1, 2025. Applications can be mailed, delivered in person, or emailed.

You will be notified via email by March 8, 2025 that your application has been received. You will be notified via email by April 1, 2025 of your award status.

United Way's mission is to unite people and resources to improve people's lives in our community. We fight for the *education, health, and financial stability* of every individual, and encourage students to volunteer in those three community impact areas.

United Way of Olmsted County is a community change organization that collaborates with partners, accelerates impact, and drives changes identified by community members. 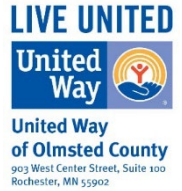

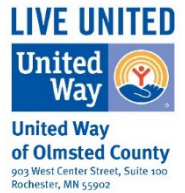

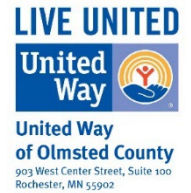

2024-2025 School Year

Required Volunteer Time

The Varsity Letter in Community Service Program recognizes students that volunteer 100 hours in one school year (served between 3/1/2024-2/28/2025). *With 52 weeks in a year, that is equivalent to about 2 hours per week.*

Qualifying Volunteer Activities

United Way's mission is to unite people and resources to improve people's lives in our community. We fight for the education, health and financial stability of every individual, and encourage students to volunteer in those three community impact areas.

What if my volunteer activity doesn't fit in the categories of health, education, or financial stability?

United Way of Olmsted County *encourages* volunteer opportunities in these specific areas of community impact. However, there are many local nonprofits within different areas. *Example* opportunities that would fall in the "Other" category include animal shelters, arts/humanities, business leagues, churches/religious organizations, and social/recreation clubs with 501(c)(3) status. Please check the appropriate box on your verification form. *If you are unsure whether a certain activity meets the volunteer requirements, please contact Sonja via email sonjas@uwolmsted.org or by phone (507) 535-5509 to verify *before you start*.

- I have made a copy of my application and any/all verification materials for my future reference
- I have reached out to my mentor and/or the VLCS program coordinator at United Way of Olmsted County to have all of my questions answered

VARSITY LETTER IN COMMUNITY SERVICE

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. The requirements state that I must complete at least 40 hours in a “non-school activity”. What type of volunteer work counts as a non-school activity?

Volunteer work must be completed with a non-profit organization with a 501(c)(3) status. Listed on page 4 are just a few ideas; there are **many** ways to volunteer in your community. If you have further questions or need ideas, please visit Get Connected at: <http://volunteer.uwolmsted.org/>

If you're uncertain about whether volunteer work you're doing could be counted towards the Varsity Letter in Community Service award, please email sonjas@uwolmsted.org or call 507-535-5509 to verify before you start.

2. The requirements state that I have to complete at least one “school activity”. What types of volunteer work count as a school activity, and how many hours do I need?

The following is a list of activities that can be done in school. These are just a few ideas, not a complete list. Again, if you are uncertain if an activity counts, please email sonjas@uwolmsted.org or call 507-535-5509 to verify before you start.

- *Participating in a community service project through a school club (National Honor Society, Key Club, etc.)*
- *Assisting a teacher before, during, or after school, or during the summer*
- *Assisting at sporting events, concerts, theater productions (if not required for a class)*
- *Tutoring peers through a school tutoring program (If tutoring hours are performed, please list the school volunteer supervisor as the contact, not the tutee or the tutee's parent/guardian).*

There is NO hour requirement for school-related activities. Sometimes, work done through a school group can be counted as school related OR non-school related work. For example, if the work was done with an outside organization (e.g. Participating in Relay for Life as a Key Club member), you may count the hours where you need them.

3. Who should I list as my supervisor?

Your advisor is the adult supervisor, mentor, or advisor that has supervised your volunteer work and can verify that you volunteered with their group or organization. You MAY NOT list a student or peer as your contact supervisor.

4. I volunteered on a mission trip through my church, how do I count these hours?

The Varsity Letter in Community Service program targets volunteering locally in or near Olmsted County. If you volunteer on a mission trip or other volunteer vacation, the hours are calculated as follows:

- During the school year: no more than 10 hours per day
- During the summer: no more than 10 hours per day
- No more than 40 hours total outside Olmsted County.

5. I volunteered as a camp counselor; how do I count those hours?

The Varsity Letter in Community Service program targets volunteering locally in or near Olmsted County. If you volunteer as a camp counselor, the hours are calculated as follows:

- During the school year: no more than 10 hours per day
- During the summer: no more than 10 hours per day
- No more than 40 hours total outside Olmsted County.

6. I have to complete community service hours so that I can graduate. Can I count these hours?

Any community service or volunteer hours done to meet a graduation requirement DO NOT count.

7. I must complete community service hours for a class. Can I count these hours?

Any community service or volunteer hours done as a class requirement DO NOT count.

8. Can I count my time helping with yard work or housework?

Any yard work or housework performed with a qualified non-profit (such as Family Service Rochester's Neighbors Helping Neighbors program) CAN be counted for this award.

- In cases where you are assisting an individual on your own (not related to you or living in the same household) please photograph the experience and communicate with Sonja Sommerfeldt, Impact Program Coordinator at United Way of Olmsted County, about including her on your Volunteer Supervisor for that verification form.

9. I volunteered with a local company but wasn't paid for my work. Can I count these hours?

Unfortunately, no you cannot. If the company is not a nonprofit organization, we cannot count these hours. This includes many childcare facilities that are for-profit organizations. Be sure to check with the organization you are volunteering with ahead of time to ensure they meet the guidelines.

HELPFUL HINTS

- Remember to track your volunteer hours as you perform them.
- Use the optional checklist provided in your application to ensure your application is complete.
- Remember that United Way of Olmsted County must receive your application by March 1, 2025.
- For volunteer work spent with one group or organization, you only need to complete one verification form (paper or electronic) summarizing all of your volunteer work for the timeframe.
